ADA F. KARG, age 100 of Harbor Beach, passed away Friday, April 6, 2018 at Huron Medical Center, under hospice care.

“ I have known Ada Karg my entire life. My parents & the Karg's were neighbors, friends and belonged to the same Lutheran churches. We used to visit often with a special memory being Sunday night visits to watch “Loretta Young” and other shows on their TV. I was 10 before we had our own TV!

Harry & Ada were married for more than 60 years and were devoted to each other. In spite of their many descendants, Ada proudly displayed all their photographs and shared stories, able to recall every child's name. She was very pleased to tell me when Aaron named his daughter after her grandmother! Another relative we fondly remembered was her niece and my good friend, Gloria Learman Cox. I met Gloria at a Karg gathering when we were little girls, remaining friends until she died 12 years ago.

Ada was a creative person and another memory I have is about her quilting skills. After a gathering at my parents' home when four couples spent a day visiting and the ladies were helping my mother complete a quilt, my mother said, “You can tell where Ada sat, her stitches are the smallest.” Ada used to quilt weekly with the ladies at Zion.

After Lillian Karg died, I stopped in for visits more frequently and eventually began filling Ada's medication pillboxes for her and taking her to church, the doctor, etc. I refused accepting any payment from her and instead, she always offered me chocolate truffles before I left her. I surely enjoyed the treat and the tea or meals we shared together.

A few years ago, I was instrumental in convincing her to spend a winter at Country Bay in Pigeon and then, she moved to Meadow Lanes. She adjusted to her new home, but often stated how she missed shopping! She was always well-dressed & wearing jewelry so on at least 3 occasions, I shopped for her at Macy's picking up several sweaters and tops. She would then “shop” for the one or two of them as a gift from me. It was fun.

*Whenever I stopped to visit her, she'd say, "Joann, you're here." When I left, I'd give her a hug and she would tell me she loved me. I will miss her and that endearment.*

*Ada was blessed with a loving husband, many others, who loved and respected her for 100 years in this world. She was a good Christian, believing her Savior died for her on the cross and now, my dear friend is enjoying her heavenly home.*
