Alfred P. Welker Jr, age 85 of Harbor Beach, passed away Friday, January 12th at Lakeview Extended Care and Rehab Center of the Harbor Beach Community Hospital.

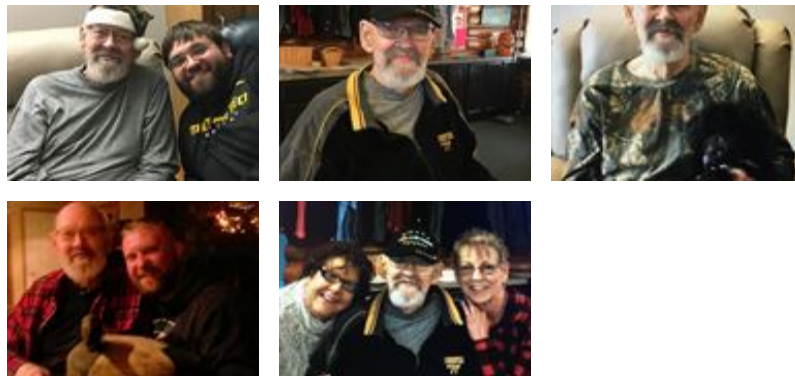
