HENRY H. WINKEL, age 95 of Harbor Beach, passed away Monday, January 19, 2015 at Lakeview Extended Care and Rehab of the Harbor Beach Community Hospital.

He was born on October 9, 1919 in Stolp, Germany to the late Franz and Marie (Lull) Winkel.

Henry was a long-time employee of the Hercules Powder Company, working in the chemical lab, retiring in 1974. He was a member of Zion Lutheran Church in Harbor Beach. Henry enjoyed fishing in Harbor Beach as well as Lake St. Helen. He was an avid UofM Wolverine fan and enjoyed watching the Detroit Tigers and Lions and listening to polka music, especially Molly B.

Henry is survived by a brother, Victor Winkel of Harbor Beach and a sister Gerda Odinga of Zephyr Hills, Florida. He is preceded in death by two brothers Gerhard Winkel and Helmuth Winkel and a sister, Ruth Lovejoy.
