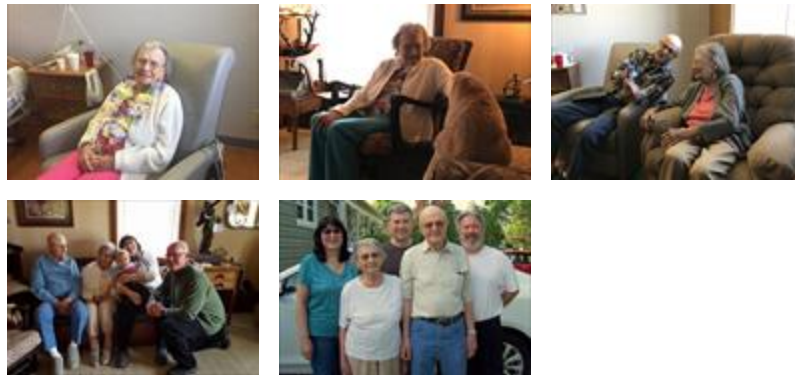

We four laughed at all sorts of shows and personal jokes, and I learned things I had in common, like how she had sewn a whole wardrobe of doll clothes for her daughter just like how I loved to sew doll clothes. She did it because she loved her daughter. I never once doubted that she loved me and all of us. I will always be so grateful to have gotten that chance to get to know Grandma and Grandpa better.

The last time I got to see her in person, she and Grandpa met John who I was about to date and eventually marry. And as Grandpa and John laughed and talked, Grandma girlishly slipped her hand into mine and whispered with a twinkle, "He's nice, isn't he?" I will always cherish that friendly, grandmotherly approval.

Some day in heaven, I'll get to slip my hand back into my grandma's, and we will laugh and just sit and talk all over again.
