William Sid Holodnick, age 74 of Port Hope, passed away Tuesday, April 18, 2023 at McLaren Port Huron Hospital.

He was born on May 8, 1948, in Lexington, to the late John and Leona (Champagne) Holodnick. Sid and Nancy Reibling were united in marriage on March 24, 1972 in Aldingen, Germany. Sid received his Masters Degree from Ferris State University and worked in education his whole career. He was a teacher for many years, and ended his career as the technology Director for Muskegon Heights Public Schools.

Sid deeply loved Port Hope and its people. He left a piece of himself in many projects around the community. He loved woodworking and building restoration. He was a huge member of the Port Hope Area Historical Society, which just recently finished the Port Hope Depot and was currently working on the Brinker Lumber Yard. He enjoyed playing and singing music. Including participating in the All For Hymn choral group. He also enjoyed doing genealogy research and being with family and friends.

He is survived by his wife, Nancy Holodnick of Port Hope, children: Stefan Holodnick of Auburn Hills, Karl (Beatrix Czeglédi) Holodnick of Northville, Peter (Erin Largent) Holodnick of Marquette, 3 grandchildren: Charlie, Maeve, Flora, siblings: Jack Holodnick, Jim (Jessica) Holodnick, Sue (Mike) Healy,

Steven (Cherie) Holodnick, brother-in-law Dan Kramarenko and many nieces and nephews.

Sid was preceded in death by his sister Nancy Kramarenko and sister-in-law Beth Holodnick.

Cremation has taken place. A memorial service for Sid will take place on Saturday, April 22, 2023 at 11 am at the Port Hope United Methodist Church, with Rev. Karen Kinney officiating. Burial will take place at a later date. Friends may gather at the church, beginning at 10 am until time of services at 11 am. Arrangements are being handled by the Ramsey Funeral Home of Harbor Beach.

“ In 1964/65 I was an exchange student living with Nancy, Cal and Lela on the farm north of Elkton. I was extremely well welcomed, mainly by them but also by their relatives and the whole community. During the hay harvest in 1965 Cal called Sid to help. I think that was when Sid's and Nancy's relationship started. We already knew Sid from riding the same school bus every school day. From then and on we have been in touch – since internet came along through e-mail and Skype. Nancy worked for a couple of months in Stockholm early 70: ies which gave us a chance to see each other fairly often. And Sid came to visit. In 1997 we, including kids, met in Germany when we were all on vacation. In 2015 I visited Nancy and Sid when I came to Michigan for the 50-year reunion of class -65 of Lakers high school. Then we also did some traveling. Then I was so happy to see the good life they had with house and friends, their joyful and respectful relationship, and their firm interest in the restoration of Port Hope. Thinking in line with his spirit was enough of a model to inspire me, and I am sure it will continue to do so for years to come. His family, friends, and a wide community reaching from Port Hope to the many places he lived and traveled to (or researched) are all better people for having been touched by him.
